



The very clear and well balanced picture on the reverse side of this page was taken by Edgar C. Rogers around 1910. Every year after the ground had stopped freezing and thawing in the spring, the roads rough from the winter's heavy teaming needed to be leveled and scraped. This the crew pictured above were doing when the picture was taken. Driving the four horse team was Charles B. Perkins, a son of William the second; operating the machine was Zina E. Sherman, our famous dancing teacher, highway commissioner, and tax collector for forty-five years; and at the rear wheel stood John F. (Ding) Raymond, a town character of the period.
