This is one of the finest old houses in Plympton. It is the first on Elm Street after leaving the Green. Rev. Elijah Dexter ^{lived in} ~~built~~ it soon after he came to Plympton in 1809. Here he lived while serving the Plympton parish during the next 42 years. Soon after he left Plympton in 1851 Ephraim Fuller bought the place and reared his family of five children--three boys and two girls. The place was more or less unoccupied after 1900. Clifton Bricknell bought the farm in 19 and now makes it his home.

Somehow one feels the spirit of a country parson in the atmosphere of the fine old rooms. Perhaps the old building has absorbed some of the spirit of parson Dexter, he had enough for himself, the building and the town.
