



THE STEPHEN BRYANT HOUSE

This fine old building on County Road, the second on the north side after crossing the Jones River Brook, traveling east towards Kingston, is the oldest house standing in Plympton today. The eastern part of the main building was erected by Mr. Bryant some years previous to 1700. In 1703 he sold the property to Dr. Caleb Loring who built the western part of the main building and added the ell to the original part. Many years before 1900 it was the homestead of Winslow Wright Sr., and for several years after that date it was the home of his daughters, Lydia A. Wright and her sister Mary.

As these lines are written it is still in a fine state of preservation and in use as a residence. It stands today the only human made landmark which has been a witness to Plympton activities almost from the date of its beginning as a community over two hundred and sixty years ago.
