

PLYMPTON BOARD OF SELECTMEN  
MINUTES  
November 3, 2008

Attendees: Joe Freitas, John Henry, and Barry DeCristofano

Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm.

The Board met with Bill Slater regarding the fund raising activities for the South Shore Community Action Council. On behalf of the Town, Mr. Freitas presented a checks totaling \$1329 to Ms. Pat Daily, Executive Director of the South Shore Community Action Council.
